Several years ago, at a Special Olympics track meet, nine contestants, all physically or mentally challenged, assembled at the starting line for the 100-yard dash. As the gun sounded, they all started out, not exactly in a dash, but with an excitement to run the race to the finish and win.

All, that is, except one boy who stumbled on the asphalt, tumbled over a couple of times and began to cry. The other eight children heard the boy cry. They slowed down and looked back. Then they all turned around and went back. Every one of them. One girl with Downs Syndrome bent down and kissed him and said, "This will make it better." Then all nine linked arms and walked together to the finish line. (*Denny Mog, Touched by an E-mail, page 195*). The spirit of scouting lived in these young souls. First, to Be Prepared. Second, to make sure that the world becomes a better place by the influence they exude.

The vision of those children is the church's vision of what the Kingdom of God means. It's one of the reasons I love the church so much. We live in a world that preaches, "Everyone for themselves!" "Watch out for number one!" "If you're not the lead dog, the scenery never changes." "Climb the ladder of success no matter what you have to do and no matter who you have to hurt." Our world often advocates that our interest should be singular and inward. The church preaches otherwise. I, for one, am glad that Jesus comes and turns life upside down.

His example and truth "honors" those who "help the weak, encourage the fainthearted." Jesus values those who "do not repay evil for evil, but instead seek to do good to one another." It's good when we take prayer seriously rather than trying to use our wisdom to figure out situations and circumstances.

That's one of the reasons I "run" to the church each chance I get. In the church God's people care for one another. It is the place where when someone falls...others will stop their journey and pursuits...turn around and come back to help. In the church, it is the goal that we win everyone to the Kingdom.

It's my kind of place. It's a place for Scouts and their leaders. I believe that Scouts are one of the groups within the church that can change the world.
