
PARSON TO PERSON

I am not a fan of *Reality Television Shows* for several reasons. The first is that if what I see is *reality* that in and of itself creates more concern than I can voice in the space provided here. The second is that the *reality* people pursue is generally money. The third concern is how these *reality* stars treat one another and abuse one another verbally. It is, for me, human behavior at its worst, and I prefer not to watch it. So, I do not wonder about who is surviving on what island location. I do not give a care about Big Brother nor would I want any of them to be my relatives. I do not care to know what it means to grow up with the Kardashian Family nor do I want to know anything about the Real Housewives of any location.

There was an occasion when Paul and Barnabas were in Lystre and Derbe. The people there marveled at the words spoken, and they determine that "the gods have come down to us" and a sacrifice must be made. The sacrifice to be made will be made to Paul and Barnabas. The Apostles are shocked over how the people see them. They try their best to convince the crowds otherwise. But the crowd has made up its mind, and set its mind on the reality it wants to see. The lesson declares, "Even with words, they scarcely restrained the crowds from offering sacrifice to them."
