The Election of New Bishops

Many of us recently heard former First UMC pastor Morris Thompson mention Dr. Tim McClendon in his sermon on June 10. He spoke with hope that Tim will be elected to the episcopacy at Jurisdictional Conference. I share Morris' hope, and I know that many of you do as well. Here are some questions I respond to from time to time:

Q: When will new bishops be elected?

A: July 18 through 20 at the Lake Junaluska Assembly in North Carolina

Q: Are Tim's chances pretty good?

A: Yes, Tim ran a close second in all the balloting four years ago, but the Jurisdictional Conference had only one vacancy to fill. Elections are held as needed once every four years. Five bishops in the Southeastern Jurisdiction are retiring this summer, so there are five openings this time.

Q: If he is elected, could Tim be our bishop in South Carolina?

A: That's extremely unlikely. New bishops are assigned away from their "home" annual conferences. Tim would be assigned somewhere in the Southeast.

Q: (And a question I haven't heard yet) Paul, will you be there?
