

From the Director of Music

all words that we hear at Christmastime. "Peace on Earth. Good Will to Men," in the hymn "Hark! The Herald Angels Sing" reminds of what the author of the Gospel of Luke records the angels sang at the Nativity of Christ. For nearly 2, 000 years, the church has sung what is referred to as the "Gloria." The "Gloria" is the second part of the Ordinary of the Mass, which is sung most of the year by Roman Catholics, Episcopalians, and Lutherans. This joyous song of praise is omitted during Advent and Lent, as these church bodies view the seasons of Lent and Advent to be seasons of preparation and penance.

How do we prepare for the coming of Christ in our lives? We, too often, fall into evil snares of commercialism and want to celebrate Christmas and sing Christmas carols during the month of December. At the same time, once Christmas day is past and all the presents have been unwrapped, we want to take down Christmas tree and stop singing the songs of Christmas. We need to remember there are 12 days of Christmas, December 25-January 6th. There is an ongoing debate among clergy, church musicians, and church members as to how best to celebrate the Advent and Christmas seasons.

On Sunday, December 9, 2012, Pastor Paul preached about the second coming of Christ and of patience. It is human nature to want to be gratified and satiated in the present, and do not want to prepare ourselves. Most high school and college students cannot expect to do well on a final examination if he/she doesn't prepare by studying throughout the semester. The choir

sang a Taizé chant entitled "Prepare the Way of the Lord, " which was based upon the words of the prophet Isaiah. We must believe in the salvation that Jesus brings.

How do we receive the "Unspeakable Gift" of God? As adults we have a hard time accepting that anything is free; however, Christ was freely given as the Savior of the human race. No matter how old we are, if we are to receive the fullness of God, we must receive with child-like faith that doesn't question the sovereignty of God and the sacrifice that Christ made on our behalf.

"Joy to the World, the Lord is come! Let Earth receive her King. Let every heart prepare Him Room..." This joy comes only through receiving Christ and allowing him to be first in one's life. As carolers sing the songs to shut-ins, they bring the love and joy of God to those whose days may seem long and dreary. God's gift of music can help transform and move us and others to a higher plain.

Finally, if we don't have hope, we don't have anything. The belief in hope of the forgiveness of sins and resurrection of the dead is all in vain if we don't know Christ. We must strive to follow the lead of John the Baptist, whose popularity proceeded Christ's, but quickly diminished after Christ's baptism. By humbling ourselves, we allow Christ to work through us, and it's then we can truly have an abundance of joy.

It is my prayer that each and every person experiences Hope, Love, Peace, and Joy this year.
