ORGAN NEWS — Why aren't we using the organ in our worship services? The pipework still remains in place in our sanctuary-all 2,000+ pipes, but the organ console is in the workshop of Robert Coulter in Atlanta, Georgia. Mr. Coulter has been extremely helpful to us since we first contacted him in May 2011. One issue, which has caused a lengthy delay, was that the console contained some plywood parts; those sections of the console had to be rebuilt for the console to have a uniform appearance. Further delays have been caused by supplier error. We currently expect the organ console to be returned on January 2, 2013.
