Pastor's Reflection

A New Twist to Lenten Discipline

Have you ever thought about how accustomed you are to MOV-ING and DOING? Many of us, and most definitely Yours Truly, stay on the go all day long. If our feet aren't moving, we're still doing something with our hands. If we aren't talking to someone or communicating through some electronic device, then we are still in motion, working, playing, listening or checking out our surroundings.

We may be quite still...almost motionless as we watch something once a week; I invite you to take or read something. Our need to be doing something may lead us to FIDGET until we can find SOME-THING to keep us busy.

We are creatures of movement and action. It's hard to JUST SIT STILL.

This Lent I want to issue a challenge. For five or ten minutes a day, preferably in the morning, just sit still, stay quiet and listen to God.

You might keep your Bible and

vour devotional book on the table so that you will not be tempted to read. In quiet and stillness, listen for the movement of God's Spirit. Watch for the arrival of God.

A few minutes of quiet stillness like this will be very hard for many of us, but I promise it will bring results. It will put you into the presence of God.

So I am suggesting a unique Lenten discipline. In place of giving up sweets, or caffeine; in place of skipping a meal once a week; in place of fasting twenty-four hours on this most challenging discipline.



Financial Report to FUMC Members

- 1. 2012 Year Ended year with a surplus of \$19,264. Apportionments were paid at 100%. Surplus will be applied to church Contingency Fund. The Contingency Fund is for church emergency use only.
- 2. 2013 Budget was approved by the Finance Committee and then the Church Council on January 27, 2013.
- 3. Projected 2013 church expenses are \$372,881. Projected 2013 church income is \$356,642. This is a deficit of \$16,239 as we begin the year.
- 4. Projected church expenses represent a \$30 reduction from 2012 budget. Projected church income represents a reduction of \$3,948 from 2012 budget.
- 5. Each church financial year stands on its own. In 2012 we started with a deficit and were blessed with a surplus at the end. We start 2013 again with a deficit. This will again be a challenge. The Finance Committee wants each church member to know where we stand as we begin 2013.
- 6. Thanks for your attention! Please be in prayer for First United Methodist church as we venture into year 2013.
