I may have surprised you during the Easter Morning Service when I decided to teach a new song without accompaniment. It was my intention to teach the congregation to look beyond the four walls of our church building; to take a glance of how some Christians in the Caribbean Islands proclaim Christ's Resurrection. There are new ways we can show the Love of Jesus each and every day. LOVE. Love is the raison d'etre, or His reason of being, for his incarnation, suffering, death, and resurrection. There are new concepts that can be gleaned from the lessons we learned long ago.
