FROM THE BOOK "OUR STORY"

"In 1971, under the pastorate of the Rev. Thomas Kemmerlin, a study committee recommended the addition of six Sunday School rooms for the children's and youth departments. The cost of this project was \$35,000.00. The Building Committee consisted of C.E. Watts, Glynn Baker, Thomas Hennessee, Thomas R. McMeekin, C.A. Harris, Campbell Laney, Hope Shuford, and Ford Henley.

Property was acquired from The Baptist Church for a day care center established in 1978 during the tenure of Rev. Thurman Vickery.

The Ladd property, at the corner of Market and Third Streets, was additionally acquired in 1980 for \$65,000.00. The church received several contributions, but the bulk of money came from the sale of the Edson Moore estate, which had been previously willed to our church.

It was in 1995 under the pastorate of Dr. W. Timothy McClendon when our Trustees saw the need for modern upgrades to the existing buildings due to steady growth in membership and a sound financial structure. Studies conducted found that a major expansion was needed. Plans were laid for the largest building project in First Church history. Architect, Paul Woody from Matthews, N.C. and general contractors, P.F. and Perry Mungo, Inc. were hired. A Building Committee was comprise of Dick Griggs, Chairman, Rev. Morris Thompson (the incoming minister replacing Tim McClendon in 1997), Lib Norton, Rhett Butler, Zenda Rushing, Jerry Turner, Herb Foster, and Bill Eutsler. Ethel Ann Streater was chosen as Chairman of the Decorating Committee."

"Enthusiasm for this new facility grew quickly. Jim Crawford, III was chosen as Finance Chairman and the Financial Committee committed to having \$250,000.00 on hand before any construction began. A three-year pledge from the congregation was solicited in order to fund this \$900,000.00 expansion."

"Groundbreaking for this monumental project began on June 8, 1997, and the dedication took place May 16, 1999 during Rev. Morris Thompson's appointment. It was the hope that the new fellowship hall facility would allow the ministry of First United Methodist Church to grow and reach out to the community as it entered the twenty-first century."
