Summarized convictions from the booklet 'The Lord's Supper' by F. Levon Hucks

----The Lord's Supper is the normative pattern of Christian worship. It is the uniquely Christian pattern. The full service of Word and Table has been the chief form of worship for the vast majority of Christianity since the earliest days of the church.

----The Lord's Supper proclaims the entire span of the gospel and the saving work of Christ. This includes not only his death, but also his life and ministry, his passion, his resurrection, his post-resurrection of appearance, his present covenant with us, and the expectation of the eschatological messianic banquet. The Lord's Supper is a thankful celebration of all the saving work of Christ in all places and all ages.

----The Lord's Supper is basically actions and symbols, not words. These symbols and action witness to the unity of the body as the people of the Church gather around the table of our common Lord. These symbols show the extension of incarnation experience; it is an act of giving, not taking.

----The Lord's Supper is a meal. The bread and wine are actually real food and real drink as they would be with any meal. It has its roots in the early Christian ministry, such as the meals Jesus shared with his followers, the feeding of the five thousand, and the wedding feast in Cana. The meals were characterized by joy and gladness.
