COMMUNITY CHOIR VETERAN'S TRIBUTE — On Nov. 12 at 7:30 pm, the Veterans' Tribute by the Community Choir and sponsored by the Cheraw Arts Commission will be presented at the First United Methodist Church. This yearly program rotates among the various churches in Cheraw. There will be many patriotic songs sung by the choir. Our special guest this year is Anthony Funderburk, who was a member the US Army drill team of the Old Guard. He was a Senior Soloist which is a very prestigious position within this elite group. He will be performing a solo routine using a REPLICA Springfield 1903 Drill Rifle. It will be announced in the program that the rifle being used is not a functioning rifle. It has no moving parts and is not a real rifle in any way other than outward appearance. This type of drill rifle is routinely used in high school drill teams and civic events. The replica rifle has been generously donated by Drillmaster John K. Marshall of Melbourne, Florida. Mr. Marshall plans to drive all the way from Florida to attend the program. There will be a reception following the program to honor our vets.

Note: Our District Superintendent has approved this event in the church and agreed an explanation be given to the attendees regarding the replica rifle.

UMVIM TRAINING — With the ERT phase coming to an end in the flooded areas, the UMVIM phase will begin. It is estimated that the UMVIM phase, recovery and rebuild, will take 10 times as long to complete as the ERT phase did. If the Rescue Phase took 5 days, then it is estimated that the Relief Phase (ERT) will take 10 times as long or 50 days. The Recovery/Rebuild Phase will take 10 times the 50 days or a total of 500 days, just estimating. With that being said, there will be an UMVIM Team Leader training in November. If you would like to become an UMVIM Team Leader and help in this phase, there will be trainings on November 7 in Charleston, November 14 in Columbia and November 21 in Greenville.
