Prelude Where were you September 11, 2001? What were you doing when the world stopped turning and we froze in our tracks watching the horror unfold? Many who bid "so long" that morning never dreamed they would not return home ever again. Where were you when nineteen militants associated with Al-Queda hijacked four airliners and carried out suicide attacks against targets in the United States? Two planes were flown into the World Trade Center in New York City, a third plane hit the Pentagon just outside Washington, D.C., and the fourth plane was caused to crash by the passengers on the plane and landed in a field in Pennsylvania. This plane's target was to be the White House. Over three thousand people were killed in the attacks, including more than four hundred police officers and firefighters. These courageous public servants ran toward the danger rather than away from it. America was under attack. Do you think of it each year? Do we pause and remember? Do we pause to pray? It changed the way we view many things, but it did not change the world.
