Parson to Person — When John Glenn ventured into space it was a great day for NASA. A great deal of work, ingenuity, and effort combined to thrust the United States into the Space Age. As John orbited the earth, he took note of all the instrument panels before him. It was humbling because he said in that precise moment he realized that all the precise work before him had gone out to the lowest bidders. When one is in space circling the globe at incredible speed, it is humbling to note that someone wanted "bargain prices" for the equipment.

Everyone loves a bargain and a deal! (And I am among those who likes to find a bargain.) But sometimes bargains backfire! Things that are bought at minimum prices and effectiveness can diminish quickly. Something we might hope will last a long time may not last long at all. There is something to be said for making sacrifices and paying premium prices because quality has a tendency to last longer.

As Advent begins it is a time to pause and reflect on God's gift to the world. God's gift is costly as God 's plan calls for sending the highest and greatest heaven has to offer. God's love does not come on the minimum side, but on the extravagant. The advent of Jesus into a manger defines the length to which God goes to communicate his desire to teach us and show us the Way. The time Jesus spends among us reveals the width of God's patience as he comes to teach us rather than simply control us. The cross reminds us of the depth of God's love and how far God is willing to go in order to save us from sin and self. The resurrection teaches us that God's gift is one that goes on and on and on.
