PARSON TO PERSON - Someone sent me the following email. The man whispered, "God, speak to me," and a meadowlark sang. But the man did not hear. So the man yelled, "God, speak to me," and the thunder rolled across the sky. But the man did not listen. The man looked around and said, "God, let me see you." And a star across the sky. But the man did not listen. Thightly. But the man did not notice.
And the man shouted, "God, show me a miracle," and a life was born. But the man did not know. So, the man cried out in despair, "Touch me God and let me know you are here." Whereupon God reached down and touched the man. But the man brushed the butterfly away and walked on.
Don't miss out on a blessing because it isn't packaged the way you expect. That's the email's message. It is also the Lenten message. God reveals his Spirit among us as we journey to the cross. Beware of determining in advance the "packaging" of that spirit. God is ever present in ways we rarely comprehend. His spirit is found in moments of reconciliation and in times when children ask great questions. God's spirit is present when nature unfolds its wonder and beauty declaring its consistency. God's spirit is present in hands folded for a blessing in a restaurant. Many times we miss God's spirit because we anticipate its packaging.
Today, that love comes through the Sacrament of Communion. The place for Holy Communion has been altered within the worship service. Rather than wait until the later portion of worship, our Communion ritual wil be observed in the opening portion of worship. This means that the ushers will put the middle of the communion rail in place during the opening hymn and remove it during the second hymn. Our means of coming to the table will remain the same. The placing of the ritual will be our only change. This will make the entire focus of worship the Sacrament. The offertory will follow Communion. Then the second hymn and finally the sermon. With the sermon at the conclusion, I can edit as necessary to be a good steward of our time. Don't be thrown by the "packaging" of the service today. God's spirit is present to bless us.
