

Johnny Miller, former tour professional and current NBC Chief Golf Analyst, has a book entitled *I Call the Shots*. In his book he writes about something he calls "Welcome to Smackdown Golf." He writes: "The best U.S. Open performance of all time was by Tiger Woods at Pebble Beach in 2000. The worst performance at a U.S. Open was also provided by Woods that same year. Teeing off on the 18th hole at the conclusion of the second round, Tiger pulled his drive to the left of the famous par 5 and onto the beach. That's when he let himself have it with as vile a stream of profanity as I've ever heard on a golf course. Tiger is not the first golfer to swear after a bad shot, and a case can be made that maybe the microphone shouldn't have been positioned so close to him. What surprised me though was the way some people flew to his defense when the episode came widely to light. I heard things like "He's only human" and "It just shows how competitive he is." When someone pointed out that some kids were probably tuning in to see their hero and role model, the reply was, "Every kid has heard those words before.' The implications of the outburst came and went pretty quickly...clearly, a lot of people thought it was OK. Here's the deal: Tiger's swearing was not OK. Johnny Miller is pretty clear! He then goes on to explain his position by posing this question: Did the incident elevate golf or bring it down?

Golf is losing some of its magic because the smackdown principle of lower standards is being invoked. What's happening in golf seems to be reflective of what is happening to society. Lower standards are becoming common place because they are easier to implement. Representing golf at one time called for clean shaven faces and putting one's best effort forth in all manners of behavior. Today, "grunge" has taken over and language has dropped to new lows. A gentlemen's game has fewer and fewer gentlemen playing. The explanation is "that's just the way it is today" or "it's the way of the world." I beg to differ. WE are asked as Christians not

to "buy into" the ways of the world, but to adhere to the teachings of Christ and raise the world's standards.

The church invites people to high standards ordained by God. The Scriptures speak to this as God declares: "Your ways are not my ways." Each Christian has an opportunity through commitment to the faith to elevate life. It can't be done by the employment of lower standards. The church doesn't practice *smackdown* principles. All people are individuals of sacred worth to God. The church is a place where people can be free of some of the things that happen outside the church's doors. The church is a family and that family depends upon each other. Kindness and security are the things to discover in the church fellowship. Tolerance is not the same thing as love. God calls the church to be a place where love is the rule of life. God's love. Not the limited versions of human love that are far below the standards of God's eternal love. We make a mistake when we think our love and God's love is the same. God's love has standards and those standards come from the life of Jesus and the cross. These are the types of things that we have been talking about in our Confirmation Class. We cannot talk about real love without talking about Jesus. We cannot experience real love without the cross. We cannot receive genuine grace without the cross. Other understandings of grace are cheap grace. The church is of God and will be preserved to the end of time for the conduct of worship and the due administration of his Word and Sacraments, the maintenance of Christian fellowship and discipline, the edification of believers, and the conversion of the world. All, of every age and station, stand in need of the means of grace that the church alone supplies. (The 1996 United Methodist Hymnal)

It begs the question. Does our faith elevate the love of God or lower it?
