### PARSON TO PERSON

Vacation Bible School is here. I am always thrilled with VBS because the children come out in large numbers, their parents join them, registration is very organized, adult Bible Study moments are special, the food is terrific, our VBS staff and all volunteers see hard work, pay huge dividends spiritually, the music is great, lessons and teachers are prepared and caring, crafts are always fun, play-time on the grounds is great, and a glorious time is had by all. Many folks do not realize the hours of preparation VBS takes. The children come to church for a great time and learn how much God loves them. What a treasure!

The children see it, embrace, understand it, and hold onto it. They do so because they trust the church and their teachers. There is nothing so powerful than coming to church and learning John 3:16: "For God so loved the world that he gave his only begotten son that whosoever should believe in him should not perish but have everlasting life." It is good enough for the children to know that God loves them enough to send his son for their good.

Why do we lose that? Why is it that for so many faith and trust in God becomes so complex? Why is it that we become so demanding of God, even asking God to grant us things we know God would never agree to? Why do prayers become so self-centered? Why do people begin to wonder if Jesus is really the Way, the Truth, and the Life? Maybe it's because people have "issues" with standards. Maybe it is because faith requires surrender. Maybe it is due to our need to follow the Bible's teachings rather than fashioning our own directives.

Past President of Lutheran Seminary in Columbia, S.C. (Evangelical Lutheran Church in America), H. George Anderson, said once upon a time that his worry for the church is that it becomes "a non-prophet organization whose true colors are plaid." Thank goodness for VBS who reminds us of God's holy prophet, Jesus, who points to God's treasure of faith, and invites us to the Way, Truth, and Life that walks a road that is narrow rather than wide.
