PARSON TO PERSON

Some of you have heard me say on prior occasions that "some people have character and some people are characters." During my recent study leave where I prepared the next six months preaching schedule and selected preaching texts, hymns, and other aspects of worship I was focused on Christian Leadership. This fall, I will be preaching a series of sermons dealing with "the building up of the church" and how positive leadership impacts the church's growth. Much of it comes down to character.

Andy Stanley in his book Louder Than Words declares this: We can all name various traits that a person with character demonstrates, but what is it? Everybody agrees that character is important. But without a clear working definition, a target to shoot, we are easily deceived into thinking that we are, in fact, men and women of character....and that it's everybody else who has a problem. In some circles, people are considered to have character if their behavior is friendly or nice. Others define character as standing up for one's beliefs. The rightness or wrongness of those beliefs is rarely questioned. The fact that a man or woman takes a stand is enough to brand him or her as an individual or character. Bottom line, in our culture character is a moving target. It is subject to personality, mood, background, economic status, religious affiliation...the list is endless. The Bible presents an entirely different picture of character. Good character is nothing less than a reflection of the character of God. (Andy Stanley, Louder Than Words, pages 27-28)

I agree with Andy. Anyone can be nice. Anyone can stand and render opinions until the Lord comes back. Anyone can be divisive. Anyone can be negative. The ability to do those things does not mean we are people of character. Reflecting God defines our character. Standing for God's truth, uniting rather than dividing, building up rather than tearing down, being loving rather than ugly are important to having character rather than being characters.

May God bless us as we move to the Fall. It is a time to "Press On."
