Isaac Watts, the author, envisioned a day when Jesus would reign throughout the world – wherever the sun shines, from shore to shore. His original verses envisioned a time when all people – princes, savage tribes, people of all languages, even infants – would praise Jesus' name. Current hymnals have modernized the language somewhat.

If Watts were alive today, he would be amazed at the realization of his dream. As the sun makes its journey around the world on a Sunday morning, Christians in every time zone awake and get dressed and go to church to praise Jesus Christ. I think that Watts would be pleased.

Christ calls only a few of us to be missionaries, but he calls each of us to proclaim the Gospel. He calls each of us to give time and money to support the work of the church. He calls each of us to care about each other—and to care about people around the world.

As we sing this hymn, I invite you to do two things. First, consider all the Christians who have sacrificed comfort, safety – even life itself—to make Jesus known around the world. Second, ask yourself what Christ is calling you to do.

The late Reverend Dr. Howard Olds served the United Methodist Church faithfully until cancer ended his journey while serving as Senior Pastor of Brentwood UMC in Brentwood, Tennessee. Dr. Olds and I met at the "consultation on the larger church" at St. Simon's Island years ago. His laugh and personality were infectious. His booming voice is not easily forgotten. In a collection of devotions written by him, I found the following:

"While I was enduring an extended stay in the hospital for cancer treatment, a friend sent me this quote from Winston Churchill: "If you are going through hell, keep going." The sharp statement became my motto through the long days of recovery. Life does not promise us a rose garden. Sometimes the road is hard and downright difficult. People who know pain know what I am talking about. It feels like hell!

When life dumps us in some hellish spot like that, it is important to realize that it cannot last. No problem enjoys eternal life. Every difficulty has a life span. This too shall pass. The best thing we can do for the time being is endure the present in the sure and certain hope of a better future.

So if you are going through hell, remember to keep going. Hell is no place to stop, give up, or throw in the towel. We are not meant to dwell in hell. There will be a better day. There will be a brighter tomorrow. The loving hand of the Almighty will lead you to a finer habitat. He will see you through." (*J. Howard Olds, Faith Breaks, page 103*)
