PARSON TO PERSON

Since the dawn of creation, God has blessed humankind with his presence and the certainty that the laws created by God are laws that God will not violate. God's love grants free will to his creation and the certainty that choices we will make, while at time heartbreaking to God, will stand. Some years ago Reverend Jamie Coots, better known as the snake handling preacher, died. Jamie adhered to a practice created in 1910 of snake handling and has been bitten several times all from which he recovered. This last occasion, the snake bite claimed his life. Another voice that preached the Gospel is gone.

I am glad that faith does not call me to the handling of snakes. For some who read the Scriptures with a literal mindset, it does say in Mark (the second longer ending) "they will pick up snakes in their hands, and if they drink any deadly thing, it will not hurt them." The Bible also has a story in Acts 28 where Paul, picking up some brush to make a fire, comes up with a snake wrapped around his hand, and he simply casts it aside. Neither text says the snake "bites" nor does it encourage that we should willfully seek out handling serpents to prove the power of God. The serpent is the symbol for malady or illness. I believe that the "encouragement" in Scripture to handle the snake points to the reality of evil in the world, and God's promise that we do not have to live in fear of it. God has already overcome the world. We are free to speak the Gospel no matter how many voices seek to silence us. The church, in fact, is called to be counter-cultural and to lift up teachings and opinions that are contrary to the current ways of the world. I am saddened that in too many ways, even the church attempts to "fit in" with the rest of the world lest its words be offensive to some. If such mindset had existed in the first century, I fear that the church may not have found its life.

Our faith is in the teachings of God. I do not believe that the Bible is to be read literally in all matters. I will not kill my child if he sins. I will not put away my spouse if she disagrees with me. I will not avoid the sick fearing that I could catch their illness. I will not believe that women are to have no voice in the church. And I will not believe that Reverend Jamie Coots had to die. How sad.

You would think that the way people avoid church in our society, we were requiring the handling of snakes. Today, we do as far opposite as you can get as the world in church bows to take Holy Communion which declares that God is the God of life.
