PARSON TO PERSON

Every now and again I like to take my car through the car wash. I am amazed at the technological advances and impressed with "no brushes touch your car." The water pressure is enough to clean my car better than I can do when washing it at home. It cost more, but it is also quicker.

Just the other day as I left the car wash, I was pleased that my car had a "spic-n-span" look. But that was on the outside. I noted in the sun's glare the amount of dust and grime gathered within on the dashboard and seats. I realized that my job was not complete, so with cleaners in hand, I went to work sprucing the inside.

As I worked, it occurred to me that cleaning the car is a lot like the soul. From the time we're children, we are taught to: Do right. Think right. Be loving. Be kind. With effort we are able to accomplish such things. The true origin of such life choices must be deeper than the surface. We have not been encouraged to "act" Christian as much as we have been instructed to "be" Christian. Being Christian is beyond the surface of our lives. It goes to the heart of every believer. When the first disciples spoke on the Lord's behalf they discovered that his love had done a work within them. God's love was not a show just for looks, but a life-altering power at work inside.

The message does not change with time. God continues to work from the inside out. The Lord's work is to inspire, to direct, to encourage, and to cleanse. I had the pleasure of working with my friend, Bill Bouknight, at First UMC in Myrtle Beach. Our work strengthened and deepened our friendship. Bill is a great preacher and I learned many things in my working with him. He is not ashamed of the Gospel in any way, shape, fashion, or form. He speaks to the Godly life with clarity and distinction. His heart is an evangelical one that wants to see the world and all believers embrace Scriptural Christianity. His own passion for Christ helped deepen my own. His willingness to speak the truth, no matter the response strengthened me.
