In a recent Advent Study, *Where Heaven Touches Earth*, the author states that we "understand the story of Christ's coming into the world. We know the drill. We can sing the hymns. We can even get that certain feeling as all the people in the church light candles and sing "Silent Night." We know the words, the familiar rituals, the smells, the meals, and the music, but sometimes the reality of the coming of Christ seems like something very distant, something almost unreal. We ask the question, 'What does this have to do with me…really?" The answer is that Christ is a gift of God…for you…this day…a Savior.
