PARSON TO PERSON

While on a flight to Houston for a conference on the value of Traditional Worship, the weather "started getting rough." We would later learn that there was a tornado to the north of Houston that "influenced" our descent. The descent was "bumpy" and the passengers were quiet except for the guy who had "one too many drinks." I was tempted to borrow some of his nourishment. Instead, I was quiet but "chatting" ...most would call it prayer. I did not ask "get me down," but prayed as I do daily: "Lord, I resign myself to your care and keeping." It is my way of being ready for what life may bring. While I cannot predict what is coming, I can be ready. Ready means placing myself into God's hands.

I know we read the Scriptures, but do we hear the Scriptures? They tell us to "hear" and to "listen" and then to "understand" and to "do." The lack of Scripture Study today impacts the world in a negative way. Without direction from above, we are left to our own devices and knowledge. In my life when I have been left to those things because I did not listen to God, I have found myself in quite a "mess." I believe God is speaking to us all daily through the circumstances and situations of living. He loans us his wisdom that we might be able to endure and persevere tough times. The Lord has a number of things he speaks about and attempts to teach us. He speaks of tithing and giving the Lord his due. He speaks of truth and the necessity of it. He speaks to preparing for the future and caring for His House. He speaks of reaching out to others and caring for the poor. I find it amazing that some people say, "The Lord has never spoken to me."

When we come to worship on Sunday morning, it is the Lord who speaks through the liturgy and what we do. He has made us all stewards of his mysteries and his certainties. One of the certainties is our caring for the ministry of the church. We met with the youth last Sunday in the Sanctuary, and Sara spoke of the importance of our worship and the special place which we have for worship. We spoke of symbols and the hard work of people that are remembered yet many of us will never know. We have been here in the center of Cheraw for so many years, and our hope is to continue into the future. What we do in the present determines our future. As we work to care for the church we honor those who lived and worked before us. We live for now and are committed to doing what is needful. Our future will be more certain by decisions and choices made today (like the endowment fund). As stewards we are called to care for the church and its ministry.
