### PARSON TO PERSON

Fred Craddock tells of a debate in the state of Missouri some years ago about a passage of Scripture: Whoever believes and is baptized shall be saved. This preacher, redheaded, red beard, and ferocious, said to Fred, "Do you believe in the Bible?" "Yeah," answered Fred. Here's how the rest of the debate unfolded:

Preacher: "What does it say? Read it." Fred: "I read it to the people gathered."

Preacher: "Do you believe that?"

Fred: "Well, of course, I believe that. But if you have a case of a child who dies on the seventh day of its life, or the ninth day of its life, it had no chance to believe or be baptized."

Preacher: "Does it say 'except'?"

Fred: "But what about people that don't have their mental faculties.?"

Preacher: "Does it say 'except'?"

Fred: And we went at it, back and forth. I wound up as the bleeding-heart liberal who didn't believe the Bible, and he came off looking like the stone statue of truth, holding up the word of Christ. (*Fred B. Craddock, Craddock Stories, page 101*)

I wonder if the preacher "got married only because it was better than burning with lust." If his children were disrespectful, did he have them stoned? Does he handle snakes? If his hand committed a sin, did he have it cut off? I am sure his answers would be "no." His rigid spirit is making a point instead of answering Fred's questions. Making points can provide little room for questions. Yet, it was Jesus who taught us the value of questioning and learning about God. It's okay to have a life that doesn't know all the answers. Questions help us seek and grow. Our preacher "friend" has forgotten that.

Reading the Bible and affirming Scripture does not indicate faith. Faith is a relationship with God. The Scriptures lead us to relationship with God. This relationship is dependent on prayer, questions, the cross, the resurrection, inspired truth, and God's grace. Our ever-growing faith must be about "who we know" as well as "what we know." But the WHO will always be greater than the WHAT.

As the Body of Christ, we have much to learn. It takes a lifetime! As the Church, we put our lives into Christ's own heart and invite him to rule ours. We are part of the Christian FAITH...not the Christian FACTS. As believers, we have nothing to prove as followers of Christ other than we follow him where he leads. Some places he leads us are easy and others are hard. Yet, he is with us and in us every step of the way. I love the Bible and I study it. It leads me closer to Jesus. Some Christians like to flaunt their knowledge of Scripture before others, and all that does is diminish chances of people wanting to read the Bible. Open your hands and hearts to the Lord's truth for what it can and will do to you. That's better than a preacher who hits people over the head with strict interpretations of the Bible that have no room for questions, and little room for growth into the faith. Our following Christ is motivated by his love for us all and his truth which helps us grow in the faith by the questions we ask.
