PARSON TO PERSON

How does God speak to the world? It is a question worth pondering. Many voices claim to be from God.

- 1. I listen as political candidates invoke "connection" to his name and indicate belief that God is for them and their ideas. Yet, that falls short because I know that God is neither a Democrat nor a Republican.
- 2. I hear certain television evangelists say that faith is "demonstrated by sending a check so gates of blessing will open." Those words fall short because faith is commitment – not just a check. Blessing cannot be bought.
- 3. I listen as persons predict the "end of time" and say God is coming. Why is fear used as an evangelism tool?
- 4. I read the work of authors who try to help me think about God in new ways (like the Shack...fun to read, but just junk theologically.) Thinking about God is good, but only the Scriptures define God.

So, how does God speak to the world? I believe it is in ways that are sometimes overlooked.

- God speaks through "bread and juice." Communion speaks of God's love for all.
- God speaks when we place water on a child's head. Baptism says we are "claimed."
- God speaks through the singing of hymns. "On Christ the solid rock I stand."
- God speaks through hugs exchanged at church and in the community. We are brothers and sisters.
- God speaks when divisions are overcome. Forgiveness is a way to live...not just an option to consider.
- God speaks when people travel to other places in mission to help rebuild lives. Someone else's home must matter as much as our own.

God speaks through acts of love, forgiveness, unity, and love. Why is it that sometimes we miss the message? Is it because we are not tuned in to the matters of heart that are sustained by God's presence and love? Think about it.
