I am here to minister with you...and to you...


And speaking of....being here for you....

Is it any surprise that people, by the millions, are pulling away from traditional religion entirely? So are you interested in being an agent of change for the church? Are you interested in being a prophetic voice that boldly calls for hope, imagination, and new beginnings within the faith arena?

If so, join us every Wednesday evening at 6:30pm, as we study scripture, ponder cultural influences, and discuss together, how we can continue to make a positive and inspiring difference for Jesus Christ...even in the 21st Century!

New Staff Position—An Update

As most of you know, a new staff position was created at First UMC back in May, 2018. This new staff position, Director of Congregational Care, replaced the former staff position of Director of Children's and Youth Ministries. Both the Children's Ministry at FUMC and the Youth Ministry at FUMC are now being led by volunteer teams, which have their own individual schedules, activities, and budgets. Pastor Kim is the staff liaison for both the Children's Ministry and Youth Ministry at FUMC.

Our Congregational Care Director is Sara Sanderson. Sara's role in congregational care is to bring an intergenerational spirit

and presence to our current faith community.

Sara will oversee our Nurture and Care Committee, coordinating our laity visitation teams to shut-ins and others who remain disconnected from the weekly activities of the church.

Additionally, Sara will coordinate our small group outings such as trips for adults, women's groups, Palmetto Ridge visits, as well as full family activities, independent of specified children's and youth ministries activities.

Also, Sara will establish and coordinate activities on the church campus, such as exercise classes, WATF, special holiday meals/ events, and faith workshop gatherings.

Finally, Sara will be the "point person" for our outreach ministry to those in need in our community, most especially, those who come to the church directly for assistance.

The Congregational Care Ministry has it's own budget. And the Congregational Care Director reports to the Pastor. This staff position is under the direction of FUMC's Staff/Parish Relations Committee.

Women's Bible Study

We all want to live a great story, right?
