Stewardship Celebration—Join Us!

In a recent blog on stewardship, the question was asked...What does stewardship look like in our lives today?

Unfortunately, many Christians today only associate the idea of stewardship with sermons they have heard about church budgets and building programs.

But realistically, the concept of biblical stewardship is much more expansive.

Biblical stewardship is a ministry where the concepts of faith, work, and economics intersect. A well known author on leadership/stewardship topics suggests four important principles about biblical stewardship which are vital to understand:

-Stewardship involves ownership...God owns everything, and we are managers, acting on God's behalf.

-Stewardship involves responsibility...while God has graciously entrusted us with the care, the development, and the enjoyment of everything he owns...we are not the owners-only the stewards. Thus, we are responsible to manage God's holdings well-and according to God's purposes.

-Stewardship involves accountability...this is the maxim taught by the Parable of the Talents. God has entrusted authority over the Creation to us, and we are not allowed to rule over it as we see fit. Rather, we are called to give an account of how we have administered everything we have been given, including our time, money, abilities, information, wisdom, relationships, and authority.

-Stewardship involves reward...the Bible shows us in the Parable of the Kingdom that faithful stewards who do the Master's will with the Master's resources can expect to be rewarded...incompletely in this life...but fully in the next.

As Christians in the 21st century, we need to embrace this larger biblical view of

stewardship, which goes beyond church budgets or building projects, though important...the biblical view of stewardship connects everything we do with what God is doing in the world.

Please join us in worship and study over the next several weeks, as we take a closer look at...our ownership, our responsibility, our accountability, and our reward of, and in the ministry of stewardship.
