Please Give Your Support, Your Care, and Your Love

On Thursday, December 13th, the FUMC Staff Parish Relations Committee Chairperson, Robert Calhoun, along with Pastor Kim, met with Congregational Care Director Sara Sanderson to discuss some upcoming changes related to her current Staff position. The proposed changes voted upon by the FUMC SPRC includes transitioning Sara into a Part Time Staff position entitled: Director of Nurture and Fellowship. Within this new capacity, the position responsibilities would include, and be limited to, the following:

- -coordinate existing lay visitation and nurture ministry -assist, by appointment only, members of the Cheraw Commu-
- nity who are in need of financial assistance and/or other daily needs
- -serve as the Staff liason for FUMC's monthly outreach and fellowship activities, in coordination and cooperation with the various ministry committees hosting the event.

This new Staff position would

be exercised within a 12 hour work week, with Sara still being available on the church campus 3 hours per day, 4 days a week.

The FUMC SPRC thought, discussed at length, and prayed hard over this decision, ultimately coming up with a plan that was in the best interest of both Sara and FUMC.

Back in October, 2018, the District Superintendent strongly advised this re-structuring of Sara's role based upon the responsibilities and duties which will be placed on Sara over the upcoming months, by both the Hartsville District Committee on Ordained Ministry as well as the South Carolina UMC Board of Ordained Ministry, in conjunction with Sara's journey within the Candidacy Process on the road to Ordained Ministry. These duties and responsibilities of this Process were re-visited by both Sara and FUMC again in November, in preparation for FUMC's unanimous "support vote" of Sara's ministry journey at Charge Conference, 2018.

Unfortunately, this new Staff title and the responsibilities accompanying it were not accepted by Sara in a follow up meeting, and thus, on Friday, December 21st, 2018, Sara resigned from her current Staff position at FUMC

We covet your prayers and your understanding as FUMC transitions through this Staff change, and we encourage you to be respectful and supportive of Sar's decision.

As FUMC continues to be Sara's Home church and simultaneously, Sara's Ministry Sponsor church, you are invited to pray for all involved in this journey, and all that these changes will bring. Your prayers for patience and a spirit of promise will be most appreciated

Wednesdays At The First

If you have spent any amount of time reading the Gospels, you may have noticed that Jesus prayed and spent quiet time with God on a regular basis. Prayer was an important part of Jesus' routine, and it was especially critical to his relationship with God. There are more than sixty occasions in the Gospels where Jesus goes away to pray, meditate, and be alone. These "away times" appear at various junctures in Jesus' ministry, and they cross different thresholds as far as importance and focus are concerned.

These prayers of Jesus, to be clear, are not ritualistic prayers offered in service as a rabbi or teacher. Rather, these prayers, of Jesus, serve as...private conversations with God the Father. Indeed, these pray-

ers, of Jesus are part heartbeat, part instruction, part love letter, and part plea, from Jesus, to His Father.

When we break down the sixty some odd prayers that Jesus prayed, or times that He taught on prayer, in Scripture, we discover that Jesus' prayers fall into five major focus areas:

- *A Relationship with God
- *God's wisdom and guidance
- *Unity
- *Living lives that bring glory to God *Consistency in prayer

These five focus areas represent the key intersections of much of Jesus' ministry...both as a conduit for how the Father is working through Him...and as a catalyst for what He intends and hopes for His disciples (us!) to become. Beginning Wednesday, January 9th, we will commence a new study entitled..."The prayers of Jesus...and ours". Throughout our time together, we will examine how the prayers of Jesus serve as a model for our own prayers...in regard to being the primary link by which we connect with God...and with each other.

Please note that beginning January 9th, we will have a new WATF schedule: There will be no dinner, so our lesson will begin at 6pm. This will allow for choir participants to begin their rehearsal promptly at 7pm.
