

A Few Words from the Pastor...

On Sunday, November 29th, we once again begin the season in our church calendar that we call the Advent season. Advent means "arrival." During the four weeks of the Advent season we prepare our hearts, our minds, and our souls for the arrival of the Lord Jesus Christ. We prepare to celebrate his first arrival, his birth. We also anticipate, prepare, and celebrate the promise that one day he will come again.

Charles Wesley's hymn, "Come, Thou Long Expected Jesus," proclaims that Jesus in the long expected one, the Messiah, the one all of Israel waited for hundreds of years to see. In the church today we experience this long expectation, this waiting, this hunger, for the arrival of the anointed Son of God during Advent. The difference for us is that Jesus arrived. He was born, lived, died, and rose again to set us free.

Our faith in Jesus releases us from bondage to sin, to death, and to fear. Because Jesus lived, died, and rose again we live abundant lives as forgiven people in the now but not yet completed work of God on this earth. We have consolation, strength, hope, and joy in our hearts and in our lives now and we know that there will be even more when Jesus returns for his second arrival.

With the restrictions of COVID-19 it might be tempting to rush to and through the Advent and the Christmas seasons this year. Let's not do that. Instead let us take this pause built into our Christian calendar to make sure we are ready for the arrival of the King of Kings, the Lord of Lords, the Mighty Counselor, the Good Shepherd, the Messiah, the Holy One, the Lamb of God, the Logos, the Light of the world, the bread of Life, the Savior, the Redeemer who will reign forever and ever. Let us savor this time together as we anticipate and then celebrate the arrival of Jesus the Christ together.


