Except for the Lord?



A Few Words from the Pastor...

The Light Shines in the darkness and the darkness did not overcome it! John 1:5 NRSV

The Epiphany season is filled every Sunday with revelations about who Jesus is. It begins with the Magi/Wise Men from the east who came looking for a new king and ends with bright light shining on the Mount of Transfiguration. The Epiphany is an invitation each year for us to remember and ponder all that Jesus means to us.

What does it mean for us that Jesus is the King of Kings, the Lord of Lords, the Son of God, the Savior of humankind? How are we to respond to who Jesus is for us with each of these revelations? These questions remind me of and encounter with a bright light some of the boys in our neighborhood had one night. The boys were out one night just hanging out by a creek that ran along the edge of our subdivision. A police car went by and shined a spotlight their way. Terrified, all of them took off running. They ran through back yards, set dogs barking, and caused porch lights to come on to see what all the commotion was. Steve and Kevin were the only ones caught as they dashed across a street right in front of the police car. The police officer shined a penetrating light into their eyes and asked why they were running, where they had been, and what were they doing. Kevin told the officer they were not doing anything but that his parents were going to kill him for being stopped by the police. The officer laughed and said something like, young men I am not here to catch you, or punish you, I am here to make sure you are safe.

The light of Jesus is like that in our lives. It is a light that penetrates the dark places revealing the places that are not safe for us. It is also a light that leads us to right paths. Jesus as our King and our Lord governs our thoughts and actions so that they are transformed to the will of God (Romans 12:2). This enables us to reflect the light of Jesus' grace, love, mercy, and peace into the darkness and to bring hope to this world. Jesus as the Son of God is a light interceding for us at the right hand of the Father (Romans 8:34). Our Savior's life, death, and resurrection gives us abundant and eternal life now and forever like a security light. We embrace and reflect this light when we accept Jesus in our hearts and profess his good news with our mouths (Romans 10:9-10).

This epiphany season let us all seek the light of Jesus and then reflect that light so others may come to see the light and know the light through us.
