This past week a friend of mine sent me a virtual hug and a article from the Cleveland Clinic about hugs. I sure needed that in a week where the coronavirus hit to close to home and felt as if it will be endless. My friend began by reminding me how in our college days our virtual hugs looked like this: (). That brought a smile to my face and joy to my weary heart. Then she included a 2021 updated virtual hug! Last she included a link to the article mentioned earlier.

The article reminded me of the importance of human touch and how much we are missing that in the current pandemic environment. Hugging raises the level of



chemicals in our brains that help us feel good and secure. Hugs allow us to express and receive positive emotion. And hugs right now are dangerous for us in many settings. Even so, there is hope. Hope that we will one day conquer the coronavirus. Hope that we will be freer in the future with our hugs. Hope in the form of virtual treasures like my friend's virtual hug.
