A Few Words from the Pastor...

"And I heard a loud voice from the throne saying, "Look! God's dwelling place is now among the people, and he will dwell with them. They will be his people, and God himself will be with them and be their God." Revelation 21:3 NRSV

Last Sunday we began a three-week sermon series that focuses on the places we dwell with our God. These places are sometimes physical locations by not always. Each week we will have a key word that helps us to pause and spend some time with God. Our first key word was HOPE. We have hope in all circumstances
