A few words from the pastor...

¹ "I am the true vine, and my Father is the vineyard keeper. ² He removes any of my branches that don't produce fruit, and he trims any branch that produces fruit so that it will produce even more fruit. ³ You are already trimmed because of the word I have spoken to you. ⁴ Remain in me, and I will remain in you. A branch can't produce fruit by itself but must remain in the vine. Likewise, you can't produce fruit unless you remain in me. ⁵ I am the vine; you are the branches. If you remain in me and I in you, then you will produce much fruit. Without me, you can't do anything. John 15:1-5

I'm participating in the Bishop's School of Ministry this week. This morning's worship focused on abiding. As the music played and the preacher gave the message, I rejoiced at being able to sit at the feet of Jesus and just abide. As I just let my thoughts wander that I finally understood what my grandparents tried to teach me about abiding. It is a blessing beyond measure of simply basking in the presence of the Lord. Nothing to do. No thoughts to program. No words to say. No actions to be taken. Just being still in the presence of God. I emerged from worship feeling lighter, relaxed, and renewed.

I believe we are in a time in the life of the church where we desperately need to take time to stop everything and just abide in the Lord. The anxiety levels about the future are off the charts. The branches are looking a bit scraggly and in need of pruning. We need to abide with Jesus, to cling to the vine as we emerge from the wilderness of pandemic. Abiding will help us, as we pray and wait, listening for the voice of our Savior to let us know the plans that God has for our future at FUMC.

In the first five verses of John 15 Jesus reminds us that he is the true vine, and that God the Father is the keeper of the vine. We are branches of that vine and we are being tended by God to bear spiritual fruit for the kingdom of God. God tends the soil. God gives the sunlight. God provides the water and nutrients we need to be healthy, productive fruit. Our job is to cling to the vine. To hold on to Jesus and bask in his presence. To accept the removal of the dead wood and the pruning of our branches. The outcome is more than we can do on our own (nothing). The fruit of abiding in Christ will overflow with the goodness of our God.

There is a fun song written by Amy Grant that I used to sing with college students that encourages abiding. The song's title is Grape, Grape Joy. Here are the lyrics:

I am a small and lonely grape clutching to the vine waiting for the day when I'll become my Savior's wine! Oh, wouldn't French cuisine just yearn it! I've eternity to ferment but knowing me I'd end up ripple in a cellar of Chablis. Are you a small and lonely grape clutching to the vine waiting for the day when you'll become your Savior's wine? Don't give up hope ye heavy laden you don't want to be a raisin; There's a grape, grape joy in Jesus in the vineyard of the Lord!

I am looking forward to the grape, grape joy of Jesus in the vineyard at FUMC as we abide together and see what fruit the Lord has for us to harvest. I don't know about you, but I agree with Amy Grant. I do not want to be a raisin. So, I am going do some more abiding with the vine in the vineyard. Hope to see you there.


