A few words from the pastor...

¹⁷ But the wisdom that comes from heaven is first of all pure and full of quiet gentleness. Then it is peace-loving and courteous. It allows discussion and is willing to yield to others; it is full of mercy and good deeds. It is wholehearted and straightforward and sincere. ¹⁸ And those who are peacemakers will plant seeds of peace and reap a harvest of goodness. James 3:17 TLB

In his book, *The Anatomy of a Revived Church*, Thom S. Rainer highlights the things that churches that were close to dying did that resulted in revitalization. Last week I shared that the number one action taken by all the revived churches was consistent and persistent prayer asking for the revival of the church.

Another action that occurred in all the revived churches was the decision to quit looking for "silver bullets" to revive the church. In our quick fix and instant gratification society, we are always looking for fast and effortless ways to do something. Sometimes those do make our lives easier and more fruitful. However, rarely do "silver bullet" fixes bring lasting church revitalization. When it does happen, it lasts only for short periods of time. The right pastor, the right music, the right program, the right financial support, or the right facilities are examples of "silver bullets" that congregations often believe will revive the church. The reality is research of revived churches showed that not one or even a combination of these "silver bullet" fixes brought about the church revitalization. Revival came about with prayer and when churches changed how they perceived and then participated in ministry to facilitate the mission of the church to make disciples for Jesus.

Revival is from God and not humankind. To partner with God in revival requires that we pray for God's wisdom to guide us to the new future that God has planned. It also requires that we test the wisdom we receive to be sure it is from God. James 3:17 reminds us of what wisdom from God looks like. Anything else is not wisdom that comes from heaven.

Again, I invite you to join me in prayer. Pray first for God to have God's way with you. Psalm 139:23-24 is one of example of that kind of prayer. Then continue to pray using a variation of Ezekiel 37:9, Come, O breath, from the four winds! Breath into First United Methodist Church so we may live.

We have a few copies of *The Anatomy of a Revived Church* available in the church office. The books were donated to us so there is no cost for a book.. Come by the church office to get your copy while they last.






Lenten Bible Study Witness at the Cross by Amy-Till Levine February 23 – April 13, 2022
