A Few Words From Pastor Debra...

Search me, O God, and know my heart; test me and know my anxious thoughts. Point out anything in me that offends you and lead me along the path of everlasting life.

Psalm 139: 23-24 NLT

It has long been the mantra of churches of every denomination that "we must do something because our church is dying." This is usually followed by a statement of what has to be done to make the speaker, another person, or some group happy, so they won't leave the church. Questions that are rarely asked are: what can we do to please God; or what does God want us to do to help revive our church. Only in a few instances have people prayed and ask God's guidance for revival in their church.

For the past several weeks, the Wednesday evening Bible study has been examining scriptures on revival and renewal. We have been using Thom S. Rainer's book, *The Anatomy of a Revived Church*, as a discussion guide on church revival. We learned that the most critical factor for renewal in revived, healthy, and thriving churches is consistent, persistent prayer.

In some cases, it took years and other's months of constant prayer for churches to be revived. In all cases, it required that the congregations make changes to align themselves with how God was already at work in their congregations and in the communities where they lived. If we truly want to see our church and our denomination revived, we must make commitments to pray diligently for revival daily and be open to change.

I invite you to join me in prayer. First, pray for God to have God's way with you. Psalm 139:23-24 quoted above is one of example of that kind of prayer. Then join our Bible study in our daily prayer based on Ezekiel 37:9, Come, O breath, from the four winds! Breath into First United Methodist Church so we may live.

We are in search of a prayer warrior to lead a prayer ministry at FUMC. If the Lord has put that calling on your heart, please come and talk with me.


