



### A few words from the pastor...

We look away from the natural realm and we focus our attention and expectation onto Jesus who birthed faith within us and who leads us forward into faith's perfection. His example is this: Because his heart was focused on the joy of knowing that you would be his, he endured the agony of the cross and conquered its humiliation, and now sits exalted at the right hand of the throne of God! Hebrews 12:2

Kate Bowler and Jessica Richie in the preface to their book, *Good Enough:* 40ish Devotionals for a Life of Imperfection take head-on the notion of perfection. They say, "we are living under the weight of the Perfectibility Paradigm." In this paradigm perfection is just around the corner, at the next class, with the next promotion, with the newest skin product, etc. We just need to try harder, do better, move faster, and keep up with those at the finish line. The Perfectibility Paradigm<sup>i</sup> tells us that perfection is a goal we can carry out on our own is the greatest lie of the natural realm that the author of the letter to the Hebrews cautions us to look away from in this life.

Instead, we are called to focus our attention and our expectations for goodness in this life on Jesus not the natural realm. We do this because Jesus is the perfection of our faith and the one who makes us holy just as he is holy, day by day. John Wesley called this going onto perfection in recognition of the fact that the perfect work of Jesus making us holy is almost always incomplete until we die in the Lord.

So, what does all of this mean? Does this mean we put up with inaccurate, lack luster performance? Does it mean we do not give our very best every day? Absolutely not!!! It means that we recognize that in all things in this life we need Jesus, his holiness, his power, each and every minute of every day. AND we accept that the grace, love and mercy of our Lord Jesus are GOOD ENOUGH. That we also accept that when we have given all we have and come in tenth place or last place in the race. It is GOOD ENOUGH. We do not have to be perfect! We just need to keep our focus on the one who is perfect and allow him to transform us and make us holy just as he is holy.

I look forward to this Lenten Season as we travel together allowing God to take all our weaknesses, imperfections, mis-steps, and failures and turn them into a life that is GOOD ENOUGH.
