A young, green donkey (not the color, that's horse-speak for not-ridden-alotyet). And folks gathered and his friends started some liturgical shouting that ticked off the local priests. So, all our hiding and pretending that we are "perfectly fine" all on our own just won't work. What keeps you from connectedness with others? Let us take a moment of silent reflection...

A few words from the pastor...

As God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience. Bear with one another and, if anyone has a complaint against another, forgive each other; just as the Lord has forgiven you, so you also must forgive. Above all, clothe yourselves with love, which binds everything together in perfect harmony. And let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, to which indeed you were called in the one body. And be thankful. Let the word of Christ dwell in your richly; teach and admonish one another in all wisdom; and with gratitude in your hearts sing psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs to God. And whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him. Colossians 3:12-17 NRSV

Chosen, holy and beloved people of God it seems very right that as we begin holy week our focus is directed to the word of Christ. The Apostle Paul admonishes us to let the word dwell within us.

One of the ancient practices of the church is Lectio Divina. It is a wonderful process that helps us to dwell in and be saturated by scripture. The first step is to read the scripture aloud several times. Pay attention to what stands out to you. The next step is to reflect in silence on the scripture and the parts that caught your eye. Responding to the scripture is the third step. Read

the scripture slowly aloud or silently and have a conversation with God about the passage asking for deeper understanding and giving thanks and praise for the scripture. The last step is to be still and remain in the presence of God and the scripture. Read, Reflect, Respond, and Remain are the four Rs that help me remember the practice of Lectio Divina. Try it this week and it will be a good enough practice to help us dwell richly in the word of Christ.

It is noteworthy that teaching and admonishing come after we are fully clothed in Christ and dwelling richly in his word. Being grounded in the word is so that we may teach and admonish each other not with just our abilities but with all the wisdom of God to guide us. We are not qualified to teach or to admonish anyone unless we are steeped ourselves in the word of Christ. We are to teach and admonish with compassion, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience.

This was counter-cultural in Jesus's day, the Apostle Paul's day, and it still is today. Teaching and admonishing are often interpreted as a green light to tell people what they should think and do rather than sharing the word of God and our testimony with them. The common idea of teaching and admonishing methods in our world today seems to be criticizing, judging, and condemning people and then expecting them to learn.

Jesus and the Apostle encourage us to be different than the world. We are to demonstrate compassion and patience with each other. To let our humility, meekness and love be teaching tools so others will come to know, love, and follow Christ. Looking forward to hearing about your adventures dwelling in the word of Christ and teaching and admonishing with your Jesus clothes shining like a beacon for our Lord.
