A few words from the pastor...



As they came near the village to which they were going, he walked ahead as if he were going on. But they urged him strongly, saying, "Stay with us, because it is almost evening, and the day is now nearly over." So, he went in to stay with them. When he was at the table with them, he took bread, blessed, and broke it, and gave it to them. Then their eyes were opened, and they recognized him; and he vanished from their sight. Luke 24:28-31 NRSV

Sunday, May 1st will mark the 14th day and the Second Sunday of the Easter Season. By this time, 2000⁺ years ago many people had encountered the risen Jesus. We mentioned the women who saw the Jesus on Easter morning in the last edition of The Connection. Luke 24:34 and 1 Corinthians 15:5 tell us that later that very same day Peter had a brief meeting with Jesus near Jerusalem. Peter will see and speak with our Risen Lord on several more occasions before Jesus's accension into heaven and we will talk more about Peter in the future.

Mark 16:2 and Luke 24:13-31 both talk about Jesus walking with two disciples on the Emmaus Road. The disciples were deep in grief and did not recognize

Jesus. They were shocked that Jesus did not seem to have a clue about the recent events that took place in Jerusalem. In this time of deep despair, Jesus comes to them, walks with them, and listens to the horrific events they have witnessed. When their sorrows were all poured out then, and only then, did Jesus explain to them using the scriptures why all they witnessed and experienced needed to happen. They invited Jesus to stay in Emmaus and he agreed. When Jesus broke the bread and gave it to them and then disappeared, they finally realized they who had been lovingly walking with them on that dusty road of despair.

One of the things I love most about the Emmaus story is the fact that Jesus listened to them before he told them anything. Even though they did not recognize him. Even though they were astounded by his lack of knowledge about recent events. Jesus lovingly walked with them and listened to them. Often the most important gift we can give someone who is suffering from grief, illness, or another heart wrenching event is the gift of our presence and a listening ear. Most of the time people do not need us to offer suggestions or give advice. They simply need and want a person who will listen to them. As we journey together during these great 50 days of the Easter Season, I pray that we will join others on this road called life and be a disciple for Jesus who is present and who listens.
