

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. It is right to give our thanks and praise.

It is right, and a good and joyful thing, always and everywhere to give thanks to you, Almighty God, creator of heaven and earth. You formed us in your image and breathed into us the breath of life. When we turned away, and our love failed, your love remained steadfast. You delivered us from captivity, made covenant to be our sovereign God, and spoke to us through your prophets, who looked for that day when justice shall roll down like waters and righteousness like an ever-flowing stream, when nation shall not lift up sword against nation, neither shall they learn war anymore. And so, with your people on earth and all the company of heaven we praise your name and join their unending hymn:

# A few words from the pastor...

What you will get is the Holy Spirit. And when the Holy Spirit comes on you, you will be able to be my witnesses in Jerusalem, all over Judea and Samaria, even to the ends of the world." Acts 1:8 The Message

When the Feast of Pentecost came, they were all together in one place. Without warning there was a sound like a strong wind, gale force—no one could tell where it came from. It filled the whole building. Then, like a wildfire, the Holy Spirit spread through their ranks, and they started speaking in a number of different languages as the Spirit prompted them. Acts 2:1-4

Jesus, undeterred, went right ahead and gave his charge: "God authorized and commanded me to commission you: Go out and train everyone you meet, far and near, in this way of life, marking them by baptism in the threefold name: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Then instruct them in the practice of all I have commanded you. I'll be with you as you do this, day after day after day, right up to the end of the age." Matthew 28:18-20 The Message

With the echoes of the gale force wind and the flames of the first Pentecost in our sights we ushered in the Pentecost season June 5<sup>th</sup>. We were reminded that Jesus did keep his word and the disciples did get the Holy Spirit and began fulfilling their commission in Acts 1:8 immediately as everyone from the known world at the time became a witness to this mighty outpouring of the Holy Spirit. The disciples began on that day, over two thousand years ago, to live out the commission that Jesus was authorized by the Father to give to his disciples then and now.

The commission Matthew recorded in 28:18-20 is alive and well today. However, sometimes we get distracted and forget what our mission for Jesus is. At the opening of annual conference on Sunday night, Bishop Holston reminded us once again that "the church was not created for our pleasure. The church was created for God's purpose." I have heard our Bishop say this numerous times but this time he emphasized that we are being distracted from the purpose of the church by worldly divisions. He reminded us that the purpose of the church is to make disciples for Jesus. Then Bishop Holston asked us to answer this question, "When was the last time that you made a disciple for Jesus?"

Over the years I have been blessed to help make disciples for Jesus in confirmation classes, on mission trips, and chance everyday encounters. Most of those opportunities came to a screeching halt in 2020 with the worldwide Covid-19 Pandemic. Add to that all the issues that surround us and I find that it is just too easy to focus on the issues rather than focusing on making disciples.

Focusing on making disciples does not mean we do not care about covid, mass shootings, political unrest, etc. What it does recognize is that the world needs Jesus and Jesus commissioned us to focus on making disciples as our priority. That is because the disciples of Jesus have and will continue to transform this world into the Kingdom of God on earth.

Matthew records at the end of his gospel that we make disciples by training people in the way of life of a disciple. We start by living like a disciple. We live so that Jesus shines through our words and actions as we offer others the grace, love, and mercy we received ourselves. Let us talk about and seek ways together that we can live out the mission of the church and make disciples for Jesus. Then we will be ready the next time Bishop Holston asks this question of us.

**Covid Restrictions Lifted** - Based upon recent and continually improving Covid-19 risk factors in the county reported by the SC Department of Health and consistent with CDC guidance, the Church Council voted unanimously this week to remove the remaining restrictions previously imposed on our activities and routines at First Methodist. Masking remains optional and we will continue to monitor the situation for changes that might warrant action in the future.

**ANNUAL CONFERENCE REPORT:** The 2022 South Carolina annual conference was held on June 5 through June 6 from the Florence Civic Center virtually. This year's theme was entitled, Seeking A More Excellent Way: Trusting, believing, knowing, God is with us.

Sunday opened with a clergy session and a commissioning ordination and retirement recognition service. Monday's session opened with a call to order from Bishop Holston and an opening devotion. Bishop Holston delivered a heartfelt devotion letting us know that regardless of all that is going on around us in this world we are called by God to lead his people to Jesus Christ. We are not here for our pleasure but to seek a more excellent way. I pray that we can all let this resonate within us as we move forward during the times of the world today.

We were greeted by the DS Reverend Terry Fleming from the Florence district. He stated that he knew that everyone missed being together and seeing each other and we look forward to next year of gathering together. We were also greeted by Reverend Josh McClendon pastor at Pisgah United Methodist church in Florence, our host for this year's conference.

The budget was passed for \$15,612,383. This is a decrease of 2.1% from the last budget. United Methodist women will now be called United Women in Faith. This year's conference closed five churches, some of these closings were due to church mergers. At 7 PM Monday evening there was a service of remembrance and Thanksgiving by the Reverend Dr. Robin Deese.

Next year's conference will be in Florence South Carolina at the Florence Civic Center, June 4-June 8 in person. For the years 2024 - 2026 The annual conference will be held in Greenville. The bishop closed the annual conference Monday afternoon by fixing the appointments. Reverend Debra Armstrong has been appointed to return to first United Methodist Church Cheraw.
