### A few words from the pastor...

Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; and there are varieties of services, but the same Lord; and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same God who activates all of them in everyone. To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good.

1 Corinthians 12:4-7 NRSV

I was re-reading a small booklet during my devotional time recently written by Rev. Bob Crossman about living out our commitment to Christ with a generous life. The premise of the book is simple. God has been generous to us and calls us to be generous to God and our neighbors. In the section on service, Rev. Crossman tells a few stories about the obstacles to generosity.

He tells on himself in the first story. One summer he noticed weeds growing in the flowerbeds around the church sign. Bob watched over the weeks as they grew taller and taller and became angry that no one was taking care of the problem. He silently prayed about it one Sunday and heard a small voice saying, "I have already called someone to maintain the church flower bed, but he isn't getting the job done" The message was received, and Bob got on his hands and knees pulling weeds for Jesus and soon others were joining him.<sup>1</sup>

Crossman tells about Mrs. Harrison in another story. Her own children were grown and they were all in their 50's but she had a God given love for teenagers. She could have ignored the love God placed in her heart for the youth. Fortunately, for her church she was there every Sunday evening coordinating meals for the youth and inspiring their faith. Bob says, "She became like a second grandmother to them.<sup>2</sup>

Fran, a seventy something woman with health problems, is another story in this chapter on service. Fran was active in the greeting ministry of her church. She served at the door greeting folks and on Mondays would write a handwritten note to visitors thanking them for coming and inviting them back. She did this for the first seven Sundays they attended her church.<sup>3</sup>

In the Baptismal Covenant we acknowledge that we each are marked by the Holy Spirit and receive spiritual gifts. The Apostle Paul makes it clear in 1 Corinthians 12 that we all are given spiritual gifts to share for the common good of the body of Christ, the church. There are many opportunities for service at First United Methodist Church, in the Hartsville District, and also the United Methodist Church.

As we renew our vows, when a young child is baptized this Sunday, let us consider how God is calling us to service here at FUMC. I invite you to call, come by the office, or text me and share the gifts God gave you and how God is calling you to use them to make disciples for Christ Jesus.




