# A few words from the pastor...

## George Washington's Prayer for Our Country

I now make it my earnest prayer, that God would have the United States in his holy protection, that he would incline the hearts of the Citizens to cultivate a spirit of subordination and obedience to Government, to entertain a brotherly affection and love for one another, for their fellow citizens of the United States at large, and particularly for their brethren who have served in the Field, and finally, that he would most graciously be pleased to dispose us all, to do Justice, to love mercy, and to demean ourselves with that Charity, humility and pacific temper of mind, which were the Characteristics of the Devine Author of our blessed Religion, and without an humble imitation of whose example in these things, we can never hope to be a happy Nation. Amen<sup>1</sup>

In his circular letter to the states, George Washington included a wonderful prayer for our country. Washington's prayer is read aloud each day at Mount Vernon's public wreath laying ceremony. This Sunday we are celebrating the freedom we have as followers of Jesus. On Monday we will celebrate the freedoms we enjoy as citizens of the United States. This makes it the perfect time for us to read and reflect on the prayer sent to the states by the first President of the United States.

President Washington begins his prayer asking God to pour out holy protection for our country. This is an important recognition that our nation needs protection by God in order for our government to succeed. Next, Washington asks God to change the hearts of the citizens from a rebellious nature to being submissive and obedient to governing by our elected leaders. Our first president knew that our government needed people to cooperate and also knew that only God could change people's hearts. Perhaps we need to pray for our country and our citizens like our first president did in order for our country to be healed from the hostilities and polarization we are experiencing today.

The next section of George Washington's prayer focuses on brotherly affection for each other as citizens and especially for those in service to our country. Washington expands from there into doing justice, loving mercy, and humble ourselves as God instructs us in Micah 6:8. He added "pacific temper of mind" and explained that was the temperament of our God. Again, if we join together living this way and praying this way God will hear us and heal our nation. See 2 Chronicles 7:14

I agree with George Washington that without each of the components of this prayer we have no hope of being a happy nation. So, as we celebrate our freedoms this weekend let us take time to pray George Washington's prayer for our country.

This circular was directed to the governors and states of the new nation. His reference to them has been replaced by the words "the United States." Otherwise, the words and the spellings are those of General George Washington of the Continental Army.
