A few words from Pastor Paul Wood...

I'm grateful to Pastor Debra for this invitation to preach here while she is recovering from surgery.

I want to use The Connection to tell you about my retirement hobby, researching and writing about the Revolutionary War in the Carolinas and Georgia.

When I arrived in Cheraw in 2008, I quickly learned the importance of Old St. David's Church and the establishment, by the Colonial Assembly, of the Cheraw District. When the Revolutionary War started, this area was a hotbed of conflict between Patriots who preferred independence from Great Britain and Tories (Loyalists) who wanted to remain a colony.

As was the case throughout South Carolina's backcountry, the people of Chesterfield County went into battle against each other. The Patriots soon grabbed the upper hand. The Tories laid low so they wouldn't be tarred and feathered, and their farms burned down.

The advantage the Patriots held evaporated when Charleston surrendered in May 1780. British soldiers quickly marched into the only inland towns – Augusta, Ninety Six, Camden, and Cheraw. They held Cheraw for most of the second half of 1780. That's when they used Old St. David's as a hospital. For many months, even after the British left, bitter fighting occurred around Cheraw as the Loyalists retaliated and burned Patriot farms. This was part of a war within a war. Most South Carolinians don't know anything about the country's first civil war.

In the winter of 1781, General Nathaniel Greene of Rhode Island arrived in Cheraw with his Continental Army. Greene's men in uniform and farmers-turned-militiamen like Francis Marion and Thomas Sumter eventually ran the British out of South Carolina. After war's end, Cheraw became a center of commerce.

Two years ago, our General Assembly created a commission to lead us through our celebration of the 250th anniversary of the American Revolution. The commission will give us many opportunities to learn more about the War for Independence and South Carolina's important role in it. One example of their work: A long interpretive trail you take by car called the Liberty Trail will run throughout the state and quite close to Cheraw.

I recommend a facility and a website for you to visit. Camden hosts a splendid new Revolutionary War Visitor Center. And the commission's web site, southcarolina250.com, provides inspiring and informative material. It includes an article by Yours Truly about a brave South Carolina heroine of the Revolution. The woman was Dicey Langston. My wife, Mary Kay Langston Wood, is a direct descendant of one of Dicey's brothers.
