Where Are You Called to Serve?

Nurture Ministries

Children's Ministries - This service area includes a wide variety of roles in children's ministry, such as nursery helper, Sunday school teacher or assistant or helping with Sunday evening activities and special events like our annual Easter Egg Hunt.



Education Ministry – This service area includes teaching adult or youth Sunday school classes, teaching or assisting in a Bible study, or teaching a special church sponsored class.

Youth Ministries - This service area includes providing leadership or support for any of a wide variety of youth ministries: Sunday evening meals, helping with fund raisers to support youth activities, missions, and trips.

Worship Ministries - This service area includes greeting and welcoming worship guests as they arrive at church, serving as a communion steward, liturgist, reader in special services, as an usher, serving in the choir, or providing special music at regular or special worship services.

Outreach Ministries

Missions - This service area includes providing leadership or support for any of a wide variety of mission programs locally and globally, such as the FUMC Food Pantry, The McArn Food Pantry, Operation Christmas Child, Shepherd's Child, Red Cross Blood Drives, Epworth Children's Home, Abba's House, and the United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR).

Pastor's Discretionary Fund – This service area provides financial assistance for church and community members in need.

Witness Ministries

Communications – This service area provides leadership and support with mailings, emails, newsletters, videotaping worship services, updating our website, and other forms of communication.

Evangelism – This service area provides leadership and support for activities and events that witness to nonbelievers.

Lay Servant Ministries – This service area is for members to receive special training by the district and annual conference to serve as lay servants and lay speakers in the local church and for the annual conference.


In sending the Gospel to the ends of the earth, we are also sharing God's Word with dozens of unreached people groups and going to hard-to-reach places to make His Name known.


