

Welcome to the new Christian Year! Last Sunday we celebrated the King of Kings, our Lord Jesus. This Sunday we begin the Advent Season preparing once again to receive the infant King Jesus who was born on Christmas Day. Advent comes from the Latin word *adventus* which means coming. Every year during Advent we prepare and wait for the coming of the baby Jesus once again.

This year we will prepare our hearts and minds to receive the newborn king with a Bible study written by Susan Robb, entitled *The Angels of Christmas*. We will explore the angels who spoke to John the Baptist's parents, Jesus' parents, and the shepherds. We will examine scriptures to learn about angels and discover evidence



of angels in our lives today. Our worship series for Advent will be based on the Worship Design Studio series, *Angels Among Us*.


