#### CHIMING OF THE HOUR

#### WELCOME<sup>1</sup>

For the truth this night is that God has invited us all to new birth and that makes us all the people on a life path who yearn for the messages of God, bringing more hope, more peace, more joy and more love to our lives. Let this be a moment of knowing these can be yours for you are loved by God!

# **OPENING PRAYER**<sup>3</sup>

Gracious God, with joy and thanksgiving we gather as your people. We have come to hear again the timeless story of Christ's birth. In the excitement of this night, quiet our hearts that we may know the peace and fullness of this holy time. Shine, O Light, in the darkness of our world. Sing, O angels, in the

#### LIGHTING OF THE CHRIST CANDLE<sup>4</sup>

**Reader One:** This night, this night is a night to remember. A night when home broke in on us. A night when we were not forgotten or alone or abandoned. This night. This night is the night when here and there became one, when past and future combined in a breathless present. This is a night when we are home, in ourselves, in this family, in the God who loved us enough to walk beside us.

**Reader Two:** We gather in the night to proclaim the light. We shrug off despair and embrace hope. We set aside conflict and choose peace. We push away despair by claiming joy. We overcome hate by rising into love. Because this night we know, even in the shadows of our doubts, we know that we are loved. That's what it means to be home.

**Reader One:** We light these candles, hoping to become the light, hoping to radiate light by how we live. We light these candles to create a space called home in this place, in our place, in inner places. We light these candles to declare that unto us a Savior is born, who is Christ the Lord. Welcomed home by angels singing and shepherds kneeling. Welcomed home by those like us who have worshiped for thousands of years. Welcomed home again tonight, right here, right now, in us.

Reader Two: It's time to be home.

Light the Christ Candle and all candles of the wreath.

# PRAYERS OF THE PEOPLE AND LORD'S PRAYER<sup>5</sup>

All: Thanks be to God. AMEN

# THE GREAT THANKSGIVING7

P: The Lord be with you

C: And also with you.

P: Lift up your hearts.

C: We lift them up to the Lord.

P: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

C: It is right to give our thanks and praise.

It is right, and a good and joyful thing, always and everywhere to give thanks to you, Lord God Almighty, creator of heaven and earth. You created light out of darkness and brought forth life on the earth. You formed us in your own image and breathed into us the breath of life. When we turned away, and our love failed, your love remained steadfast. You delivered us from captivity to sin, made covenant with us to be our sovereign God, and spoke to us through your prophets. In the fullness of time, you gave your only Son Christ Jesus to be our Savior, and at his birth the angels sang glory to you in the highest and peace to your people on earth. And so, with all your people we praise your holy name and join their unending hymn:

All Sing: Good Christian friends, rejoice with heart and soul and voice; give ye heed to what we say: Jesus Christ was born today. Ox and ass before him bow, and he is in the manger now. Christ is born today! Christ is born today! (UMH 224, verse 1 "Good Christian Friends, Rejoice")

Holy are you, and blessed is your Son Jesus the Christ, who is to be a light to the nations. As Mary and Joseph went from Galilee to Bethlehem and there found no room, so Jesus went from Galilee to Jerusalem and was despised and rejected. Your Word became flesh, born of woman, on that night long ago. As in the poverty of a stable Jesus was born, so by the baptism of his suffering, death, and resurrection you gave birth to your Church, delivered us from sin and death, and made with us a new covenant by water and the Spirit.

Then on the night Jesus gave himself up for us, he took bread, gave thanks to you, broke the bread, gave it to his disciples, and said: "Take, eat; this is my body, which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me."

When the supper was over, he took the cup, gave thanks to you, gave it to his disciples, and said: "Drink from this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, poured out for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me." And so, in remembrance of these your mighty acts in Christ Jesus we offer ourselves, in praise and thanksgiving as a holy and living sacrifice, in union with Christ's offering for us as we proclaim the mystery of faith.

# All Sing: O come, let us adore him, Christ, the Lord. (UMH 234, Last Phrase Only "O Come, All Ye Faithful"

Pour out your Holy Spirit on us gathered here, and on these gifts of bread and wine. Make them be for us the body and blood of Christ that we may be for the world the body of Christ redeemed by his blood. By your Spirit make us one with Christ, one with each other, and one in ministry to all the world, until Christ comes in final victory, and we feast at his heavenly banquet. Through your Son Jesus the Christ, with the Holy Spirit in your holy Church, all honor and glory is yours Almighty Father, now and forever.

All Sing: Rejoice! Rejoice! Immanuel shall come to you, O Israel. (UMH 211, Refrain Only "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel")


