

LIGHTING OF THE ADVENT CANDLES¹

Reader One: "The wilderness and the dry land shall be glad; the desert shall rejoice and blossom; like the crocus. It shall blossom abundantly and rejoice with joy and singing . . . A highway shall be there, and it shall be called the Holy Way; the unclean shall not travel on it, but it shall be for God's people; no traveler, not even fools, shall go astray . . . And the ransomed of the LORD shall return and come to Zion with singing; everlasting joy shall be upon their heads; they shall obtain joy and gladness, and sorrow and sighing shall flee away." (Isaiah 35:1-2, 8, 10 NRSV).

Reader Two: The prophet Isaiah tells us about the joy of ascending to God's house. The prophet tells us to imagine being set free, being unburdened, being released to live, to fully live in the grace and wonder of life itself, surrounded by those who love us like no one else. And then he tells us that the journey to get there is just as much a joy.

Reader One: The Psalmist says "Happy are these whose help is the God of Jacob, whose hope is in the Lord . . . who made heaven and earth . . . who keeps faith . . . who executes justice . . . gives food . . . sets prisoners free . . . opens eyes . . . lifts up . . . watches over . . . upholds . . . The Lord will reign forever, your God, O Zion, for all generations. Praise the Lord!" (Psalm 146 NRSV)

Reader Two: We light these candles, the candle of joyous hope, of proclaimed peace, and of deep and everlasting joy, as a sign that we are those who walk with a skip in our step because we can see the destination, and it is pure joy. We are ascending to God's promise.

Light two purple candles and the pink on the Advent wreath.

ALL SING: A candle is burning, a candle of Joy; A candle to welcome brave Mary's new boy. Our hearts fill with wonder and eyes light and glow As Joy brightens winter like sunshine on snow. (sung to the tune of Away in a Manger)

A few words from the pastor...

"I am leaving you with a gift—peace of mind and heart! And the peace I give isn't fragile like the peace the world gives. So don't be troubled or afraid. John 14:27 TLB

The world we live in today is overwhelmed with anxiety, conflict, discord, fear, hate, violence, and war. There is no question that if we rely on the circumstances and events in this world, we do not have and will most likely never have peace. That is because our worldly definition of peace is the absence of all those things. Jesus makes it clear that the gift of peace that he gives to his disciples is not the fragile peace that the world gives. The peace that Jesus gives allows his deeply devoted disciples to have peace even in the midst of all the things on earth that destroy peace.



Our faith and trust in God are the source of our peace. Psalm 4:8 says, "I will both lie down and sleep in peace, for you alone, O LORD, make me lie down in safety." Isaiah said in 26:12 "Lord, you establish peace for us; all that we have accomplished, you have done for us." 1Peter 5:7 tells us to "cast all your anxiety on Jesus because he cares for you." Jesus told us in John 16:33, "I have said these things to you, that in me you may have peace. In the world you will have tribulation. But take heart; I have overcome the world." The Apostle Paul prays for "the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, to guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus" in Philippians 4:7.¹

We are all called to be instruments of God's peace in the world. In order to be a messenger of peace, we first must have peace in our hearts, minds and souls. The way that we do that is through Bible reading, prayer, and the support on our family of faith. To share God's peace we must have the peace of God of which the Bible speaks ourselves first. It is possible to have a peaceful heart, mind, and spirit even in the midst of severe trials and tribulations on this earth. It is possible to be instruments of peace and offer God's peace to others despite everything around us that seeks to destroy God's blessed peace. The reason we can have peace are best said in the words that the Angel Gabriel spoke to the virgin Mary in Luke 1:37 "nothing is impossible for God." The teenage Mary, despite all the reasons to be filled with anxiety and fear demonstrated peace of the God as she accepted her calling to be the mother of Jesus with the words, "here I am, the servant of the Lord; let it be with me according to your Word." May we all be peacemakers who say, "here I am a servant of the Lord, make me an instrument of your peace."
