

### LIGHTING OF THE ADVENT CANDLES<sup>1</sup>

**Ruffner Family** 

Reader One: "They will not hurt or destroy on all my holy mountain, for the earth will be full of the knowledge of the Lord as the waters cover the sea. On that day the root of Jesse shall stand as a signal to the peoples; the nations shall inquire of him, and his dwelling shall be glorious" (Isaiah 11:9-10 NRSV).

Reader Two: We are the followers of that root of Jesse Isaiah spoke of. We are the ones who are now called to stand as a signal to the world, to all of creation, that peace is the will of the one who created us. Peace is the knowledge of the Lord that we proclaim from sea to shining sea.

Reader One: "In those days John the Baptist appeared in the wilderness of Judea proclaiming. "Repent for the kingdom of heaven has come near." And "bear fruit worthy of repentance" (Matthew 3:1,2, 8 NRSV).

Reader Two: We light these candles, the candle of joyful hope and the candle of proclaimed peace, in part to remind ourselves that we are a people rising toward God's promise. But we also light them as a sign to the world, an announcement there are some who hold on to hope and there are some who work the ways of peace. We stand as a sign that Emmanuel is still our fervent prayer.

Light two purple candles of the Advent wreath.



## A few words from the pastor...

Hope is an unbreakable spiritual lifeline, reaching past all appearances right to the very presence of God. Hebrews 6:19 The Message

The theme for the first week of Advent is hope. The Bible is filled with messages of hope. Proverbs 23:18 tells us that hope is for us and that our hope will not be taken away from us. Psalm 62:5 proclaims that hope is a gift from God. Psalm 147:11 reminds us that God is delighted when we put our hope in him. Jeremiah reminds us in 29:11 that God has plans to care for us, not to abandon us, and plans for a future with hope for us. There are many more scriptures on hope but these are ones that I use to remind me of the wonderful gift of hope that the Lord gives to us.

As we looked at the story of John the Baptist's parents, Elizabeth and Zechariah, in Luke's gospel this past Sunday we were reminded that our hope in God is solid. God moved beyond all circumstances and appearances and sent the angel Gabriel with the good news of the son they would have who would make a big difference in the world.

This scripture reminded us of three reasons we have hope. First, we have hope because God is present with us. The Angel Gabriel stood in the presence of God and brought a message of hope to Zechariah. When we are baptized, we recognize that we are sealed by the Holy Spirit and that the Holy Spirit is always present with us. God has promised to never leave us or forsake us. God walks with us and at times carries us through all the circumstances and situations in our life.

Second, Gabriel told Zechariah that God heard his and Elizabeth's prayers and would answer them by giving them a son. This is a wonderful assurance for us as well. We have hope because God hears our prayers and God answers our prayers too. The answers to prayers may be yes, no, or not yet. The answers may come in minutes or years, but God does always hear and answer our prayers and that gives us hope.

The third reason we have hope is because God keeps God's promises. He did to the people of Israel. He did to Zechariah and Elizabeth. God has, is, and will always keep his promises to us. That is sometimes the greatest source of hope for all of us who follow Jesus.

May this season of Advent restore, renew, and fill you with the hope described in the blessing from Romans 15:13, "May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in him, so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit."
