REAFFIRMATION OF THE BAPTISMAL COVENANT⁴

Introduction

Sisters and brothers in Christ: through the sacrament of baptism God's Spirit has been poured out upon water, water poured over and immersing us, water that flows freely for all who will receive it, water from the streams of God's saving power and justice, water that brings hope to all who thirst for righteousness, water that refreshes life, nurtures growth, and offers new birth. Today we come to the waters, to renew our commitments in each other's presence to Christ who has raised us, the Spirit who has birthed us, and the Creator who is making all things new.

Renunciation of Sin and Profession of Faith

Pastor: And so, I ask you, will you turn away from the powers of sin and death?

People: We renounce the spiritual forces of wickedness, reject the evil powers of this world, and repent of our sin!

Pastor: Will you let the Spirit use you as prophets to the powers that be?

People: We accept the freedom and power God gives us to resist evil, injustice, and oppression in whatever forms they present themselves!

Pastor: Will you proclaim the good news and live as disciples of Jesus Christ, his body on earth?

People: We confess Jesus Christ as our Savior, put our whole trust in his grace, and promise to serve him as our Lord, in union with the church which Christ has opened to people of all ages, nations, and races!

Pastor: Will you be living witnesses to the gospel, individually and together, wherever you are, and in all that you do?

People: We will remain faithful members of Christ's holy church and serve as Christ's representatives in the world. Pastor: Will you receive and profess the Christian faith as contained in the Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments? People: We affirm and teach the faith of the whole church as we put our trust in God, the Father Almighty. in Jesus Christ, his only Son and in the Holy Spirit, one God now and forever.

A few words from the pastor...

"In Jesus was life, and the life was the light of men. ⁵The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it." John 1:4-5 ESV



One of the favorite sayings of my maternal grandmother was "some people understand when they see the light and others only when they feel the heat." Social media and often the people around us focus more on the heat than seeing the light. Constant attention is given to the darkness of hatred, sin, and violence that often permeates our world.

When we focus on the darkness, we lose our way and often are robbed of the joy of our salvation. This type of focus may cause the painful fires to our hearts, minds, bodies, and souls. Focusing on the darkness causes unnecessary spiritual disorientation and emotional pain.

We all need an encouragement boost sometimes to help dispel darkness. Some of you have asked about the Peptoc Hotline I used as an example of a way to bring in some light in the sermon last Sunday. Peptoc is an encouragement hotline

created by teachers Jessica Martin and Rachel Weis with the students of West Side Elementary in Healdsburg, California. Its purpose is to bring light into the world with an encouraging message.
