## A few words from the pastor...

"The most holy and necessary practice in our spiritual life is the presence of God. That means finding a constant pleasure in His divine company, speaking humble and lovingly with him in all season, at every moment without limiting the conversation in any way."<sup>1</sup> Brother Lawrence

Brother Lawrence began his ministry as a lay person cook for the Carmelite Monastery in France in the 17<sup>th</sup> century. Everyone in the monastery liked him and admired his faithfulness. Many people had deep and meaningful conversations with him about God's presence in the ordinary moments of daily life. Some of these conversations and some of his letters are recorded in the book, *The Practice of the Presence of God*.

Be still, and know that I am God. Psalm 46:10

Brother Lawrence asserted that it was necessary to practice being in the presence of God on a daily basis in order to sustain our relationship with God. Prayer was important to the Carmelites and Brother Lawrence did believe we often felt God's presence in times of prayer. Yet, he wanted more. He desired to have a constant and deeper awareness of God's presence in his life on a daily

basis. So, this Carmelite brother began to pause for a moment of stillness no matter what he was doing to be aware of and acknowledge the presence of God. He would drive out everything in his spirit that might take his thoughts away from God. Then Brother Lawrence would ask God to give him the grace he needed to continue to be always aware of God's presence. He would end every practice with a word of thanks to God.<sup>2</sup>

Brother Lawrence rejoiced in God's blessings and presence as he cooked and then later mended sandals. He was always encouraging others to practice being in God's presence. By the end of his life, Brother Lawrence was aware of God's presence not only in times of stillness and prayer in every task he did and every conversation he had.

Take some time to practice being in God's presence this week. Stop what you are doing. Clear your mind and spirit of everything. Slowly breathe in God and breathe out the world. Be still for two minutes and allow yourself to feel God's presence. If thoughts or anxiousness invade your stillness, mentally kick them out, and invite God to still your mind and spirit. Once you have mastered two minutes, increase your time in God's presence. This spiritual practice will be a blessing for you this Lenten season.

Newton inscribed two verses from Scriptures over his fireplace to remind him of God's providential and freeing grace. The first of these is Isaiah 43:4. It speaks of God's election of his chosen people. Newton believed, in spite of all his many sins, that he was chosen by grace in Christ. The second text over his fireplace was Deuteronomy 15:15, which is about
