A few words from the pastor...

After the resurrection, the risen Jesus continued to prepare his disciples for the task of continuing the kingdom building work he started. Jesus gave a specific mission and ministry to Peter in verses fifteen to seventeen of chapter twenty-one of John's gospel. Three times Jesus asked Peter if he loved him. Three times Peter said he loved Jesus. Three times Jesus tells Peter to show his love by caring for the people that Jesus came to save.

Jesus refers to his followers as lambs and sheep in this passage. Most translations of the Bible use the verb "feed" to describe the work that the Lord commands Peter to do. However, if we look at this passage in the Greek

language, we see that it uses three different verbs to provide a depth of meaning for these commands that we often miss. The first use of the verb meant to pasture the Lord's lambs. As an expression of his love for Jesus, Peter was to care for, tend and protect the immature believers (lambs) and help them grow in faith.

The second time Jesus gave his command the Greek verb was to herd, lead, and guide the sheep. Peter is not only to care for, tend and protect just immature believers. Jesus also commanded Peter to be the shepherd of all believers. Earlier Jesus told Peter he would be the rock upon which the church was built and in this scripture, Jesus makes it clear that Peter is to be the leader of the Lord's people.

The Greek verb used in the third command literally translates from the Greek as tend, graze, and feed. From the youngest lambs to the most seasoned and devoted sheep in the sheepfold of the Lord Jesus, Peter was commanded to provide spiritual nourishment

John 21:15-17 NLT 15

After breakfast Jesus Simon Peter, "Simon son of John, do you love me more than these? " "Yes, Lord," Peter replied, "you know I love you." "Then feed my lambs," Jesus told him. 16 Jesus repeated the question: "Simon son of John, do you love me?" "Yes, Lord," Peter said, "you know I love you." "Then take care of my sheep," Jesus said. 17 A third time he asked him, "Simon son of John, do you love me?" Peter was hurt that Je- sus asked the question a third time. He said, "Lord, you know everything. You know that I love you." Jesus said, "Then feed my sheep."

and to support the growth in faith of the ones entrusted to him by Jesus. The resurrected Lord will soon ascend to heaven but the mission and ministry of the Good Shepherd (John 10:11) must carry on in Peter and in those who come after him.

We are the disciples who are to carry on this work in love. Jesus calls his people in his sheepfold here at First United Methodist Church Cheraw to love and feed Jesus's sheep. Looking forward to serving our Shepherd, Lord, and Savior with you by lovingly caring, herding, guiding, nurturing, protecting, and tending Jesus's lambs and sheep that we are called to love.
