This Mother's Day \$1,278.46 was donated by FUMC members and visitors. The funds will go to Epworth Children's Home and the services they provide in South Carolina.



ANNUAL CONFERENCE REPORT

Seeking a More Excellent Way: Breathe and Believe, Hewing Hope was the theme for this year's SC Annual Conference in Florence, SC from June 4-7. We gathered to worship and to conduct business. It was a very joyful time to gather and for people to see familiar faces, friends that they have not seen in three years; and the opportunity to make new friends. It was truly a blessing to be a part of this event. Sunday night began with a service of commissioning, ordination, recognition of orders and retirement. We celebrated 22 new clergy; 31 new local pastors were licensed and 38 retirees were honored. Pastor Debra Armstrong was recognized for her service to our Lord Jesus Christ and to the church.

The budget was passed for 2024 at \$13.2 million which is down by 15%. This is \$2.4 million less than the 2023 budget. The new budget was based on the anticipated financial loss resulting from the number of churches separating. Reverend Mitch Houston, the chair of the Committee on Finance and Administration, stated that they did not think it would be right, fair, or equitable for the churches that were not separating to have to make up the apportionments of the churches that were separating. He went on to say that their goal is to keep apportionments as level as they can for the next few years. He also stated that this is a process and it is not going to be easy. He asked for our prayers.

The Hartsville District was recognized for having a 3% increase in apportionments for the district.

Tuesday was a very somber and emotional day for all that were gathered, as 113 churches were approved to separate from the United Methodist Church. We should be very proud of our SC Annual Conference for the way in which they handled this day. It was regarded with much dignity, honor, and respect. At the end of the day, we are all still brothers and sisters in Christ. In addition to the churches that separated, three churches were closed, Lockhart United Methodist Church in Union, SC, Unity United Methodist Church in Union, SC and Bowers Chapel United Methodist Church in Florence, SC. A memorial service was held honoring 49 pastors who had passed away.

Resolutions were passed by SC United Methodists opposing the death penalty and working to address the problem of gun violence. Four other resolutions were up for consideration, but they were deemed out of order because they were submitted by an unofficial conference group and not by an official delegate or committee of the annual conference.

Appointments were fixed by Bishop Holston and are now in place. Bishop Holston will continue through 2024 as the Bishop of South Carolina. The next SC Annual Conference will be held in Greenville, SC from June 9-14, 2024.

As our own church is preparing to welcome Pastor Keith Stewart, I ask that you pray for him as he makes this transition. He will preach his first sermon with us on July 2nd. We look forward to serving Jesus Christ with him and his wife Tina.

In closing, I would like to refer to the sermon that was preached by Bishop Jonathan Holston. Second Corinthians 4:5-12 says, "For what we preach is not ourselves, but Jesus Christ as Lord, and ourselves as your servants for Jesus' sake. For God, who said, 'Let light shine out of darkness,' made His light shine in our hearts to give us the light of the knowledge of God's glory

displayed in the face of Christ. But we have this treasure in jars of clay to show that this all-surpassing power is from God and not from us. We are hard pressed on every side, but not crushed; perplexed, but not in despair; persecuted, but not abandoned; struck down, but not destroyed. We always carry around in our body the death of Jesus, so that the life of Jesus may also be revealed in our body. For we, who are alive, are always given over to death for Jesus' sake, so that His life may be revealed in our mortal body. So then, death is at work in us, but life is at work in you." The title of Bishop Holston's sermon was "Strong at the Broken Places'. This sermon really touched me and resonated with me. I ask you to be in prayer for the United Methodist Church. While we have some broken places, help us all to remember that God is with us and that we can be strong together in all the broken places.

I would like to thank you for the opportunity and privilege to represent this church at the SC Annual Conference. It is indeed my honor to do so.


