
Scouts: A Scout is clean.

Leader: And you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind, and with all your strength. This is the first commandment. (Mark 12:30)


Scouts: A Scout is reverent.

Leader: A scout is reverent toward God. A scout is faithful in their religious duties and respects the convictions of others in matters of custom and religion.





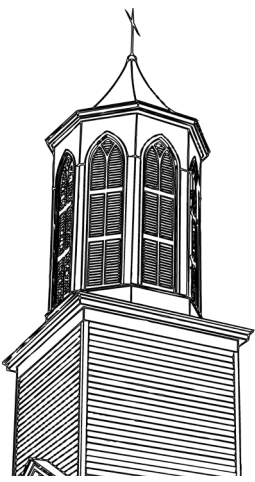
